Signing your child in and out:

All sign in and outs will be checked monthly and parents will be called to come into the centre to sign any missing signatures this includes public holidays and personal holidays.

Centre Open and Closing Times

The centres operating times is 6.00am to 6.00pm and we as a centre and you as a family are only insured and covered between those times. For the safety of the staff and children, any children here after 6.00pm parent's accounts will receive a flat late fee of \$10.00 for children that are still in our care after this closing time. All staff have been informed of the procedure when children have been picked up after 6.00pm. Family name, how many children and time they are picked up will be documented and both staff will sign. This late fee will then show on your account. Staff will also try contacting parents and emergency contacts on the enrolment forms if no one is contactable the next protocol is to call the police.

Quality Improvement Plan:

Quality Area 2 Health and Safety 2.1.1 each child's needs are supported. All staff develop an in-depth profile containing the children's health needs. Through conversations with parents we are able to make sure we have up to date information about children's health needs for example allergic reactions, illnesses (even if the child has become ill away from the centre etc. Good communication about children's Health needs help keep all children healthy and safe.

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Sun Safety:

I am refreshing everyone on the Medical Conditions and Medication Policy. Please remember that all medication must have a label with the child's name and correct dose. Any medication which isn't labelled appropriately or if this is the child's first dose of the Medication as stated in our Policy Handbook.

Fees:


Please make sure your account is up to date. Accounts help purchase new equipment and pay our dedicated staff. To aid in the payment of child care fees, from the 1st July 2000 the



Commonwealth Government has provided Child Care Benefit to eligible families to reduce fees. Parents, please note it is <u>your</u> responsibility to apply for this scheme and to follow the relevant guidelines. Families need to ensure that if multiple % are applied for that you inform Kingaroy Childcare Centre which % to apply. Unless a sibling attends our service the lowest % will be applied.

Health and Hygiene:

Nose wiping is a vital self-help skill that all children should learn to help the spread of the common cold and flu. We encourage independence skills and self-help so please encourage all children to wipe their own nose, discard the tissue in the bin and wash their hands.

- Use a clean tissue for every child.
- Encourage children to wipe their own noses.
- Dispose of tissue and glove into the bin.
- Wash hands or use antiseptic hand gel.

Cold and Flu:

Excluding sick children and educators is one of the three most important ways of limiting the spread of infection at Kingaroy Childcare Centre. Often children are unwell with the common cold (coughing, runny nose and a slight temperature) but do not display symptoms of an infectious illness that requires exclusion. Although the exclusion of a child may place added pressure on our parents and families with work commitments, we as educators must ensure the Health and Safety of all other families utilising the service and therefore the need for exclusion from the service will be at the Directors discretion. Panadol and Nurofen will not be given to children during the day to help with symptoms of a temperature. If a child is running temperatures this is a usual sign of fighting a virus and should be resting in the comfort of their own home with one on one supervision.
